THE FACTS ABOUT HIV/AIDS

What is HIV/AIDS?

HIV = Human Immunodeficiency Virus

AIDS = Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome

AIDS is caused by a virus called HIV. There is no cure for HIV. If you contract HIV, you have it for life. A person living with HIV does not look different than anyone else. HIV does not discriminate.

What does it do?

HIV attacks the immune system and makes it easier for you to get sick. After having HIV for a while, your immune system becomes weak and you can get deadly infections and cancers. This is when you'd be given an AIDS diagnosis.

How do you get it?

The virus must get into your bloodstream for you to become infected. HIV can live in blood, semen, pre-cum, vaginal secretions, and breast milk.

Four common ways of transmission

Unprotected sex (vaginal, anal and oral) and shared sex toys.

Sharing needles and equipment for injection drug use.

From mother to child during pregnancy, delivery or breastfeeding.

Tattoos & piercings that are unprofessional or not sterile.

Reducing the Risk

Use a latex or polyurethane condom every time.

Talk about HIV and STIs with your partner.

Abstinence is an option.

Never share needles. Use a new needle every time.

Tattoos or piercings: use sterile equipment, go to a reputable establishment.

Our programs and services

For 25 years AIDS Calgary has provided information, education and prevention tools to the Calgary community. We impact people's lives through support, outreach, community development and human rights services – all free of charge. We help those at risk make healthy, informed choices.

CLIENT SERVICES

Non-judgmental, compassionate and confidential information, prevention and support needs for people at-risk for, living with, and affected by HIV/AIDS.

Advocacy and Referral

Help with accessing services, dealing with barriers and human rights issues. Links to other organizations for food, housing, counselling and other needs.

Complementary Therapies

Free chiropractic and other therapies as available.

Counselling and Support

Drop-in, by-phone or scheduled appointments. Longer-term case management and support groups.

Greenbough Fund

Emergency financial assistance for registered clients of AIDS Calgary.

HEAT (HIV Education and Awareness Today)

Outreach education, support, and training for the MSM community (men who have sex with men).

HIV Information Resource Centre and Hotline

Information on HIV/AIDS, STI, Hepatitis C. Community resources and telephone support.

Outreach Services

HIV education and prevention with high-risk groups. On the street, shelters, addiction centres, the Safeworks van and more.

Prison Project

Support services and information sessions within the prison system.

Nutritional Programs

Positive Living Lunch Program: hot meals for people living with HIV/AIDS. Socialize and learn about health and wellness.

Coffee Connection: drop-in peer support. Coffee and snacks.

Good Food Box: fruit and vegetables available at a discounted price.

Community Kitchen: group-cooking of inexpensive, balanced meals. Learn about meal planning.

Safer Sex Supplies

Free condoms, lube, dental dams, gloves and information.

Spirit Helpers

Support and education focused on Aboriginal people and communities.

Transportation and Childcare Subsidies

For families with children accessing our services.

Volunteer Support

Drivers for appointments. Help with resumes, job search, housing search, tax returns.

YouthXChange

HIV prevention, education and support via outreach at youth agencies and events. Training for youth-serving professionals.

Women's Programming

Support, outreach and special events focused on women.

COMMUNITY STRATEGIES

Engages the community locally, provincially, nationally and globally in HIV/AIDS issues.

Raises awareness, provides volunteer opportunities, fosters a collaborative response to HIV/AIDS.

Speaker's Network & Continuing Education

HIV/AIDS training for schools, businesses and community groups. Speakers available.

Volunteer Program

Make a difference by volunteering for our board of directors, special events, speaker's network, client services, community outreach, complementary therapies and other programs.

Human Rights and Advocacy

Helps solve stigma, discrimination and human rights issues for persons living with HIV/AIDS, service providers and others.

Greater Involvement of People Living with HIV/AIDS (GIPA)

Offers support to Positive Action, a group run by and for people living with HIV/AIDS. Creating a place to connect and strengthen their voice.

Local, Provincial, National and International Partnerships

Facilitates the development of a collaborative response to HIV/AIDS.

International Development

Facilitates knowledge exchange through local training sessions and international projects. Internships, technical assistance and twinning projects.

DEVELOPMENT TEAM

Connects with the community by producing organizational and event communications, conducting community-based research and program evaluations, and organizing fundraising events.

Raises awareness about HIV/AIDS through media relations and our newsletter and website.
